AMERICAN HORNBEAM

Tolerates wide range of soils and moisture levels, good fall color



REDBUD

Tolerates drought and many soil types, full sun or slight shade, low-branched, purplish-pink flowers



CRABAPPLE

Large spreading, colorful flowering, attractive to birds, excellent disease resistance



CHOCKECHERRY

Changes color throughout the year, tolerant of soils and some droughts, suckers



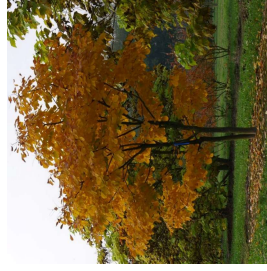
RSTC is a volunteer organization. It takes a lot to order, track, and plant trees. We have volunteers to help with activities of all types.

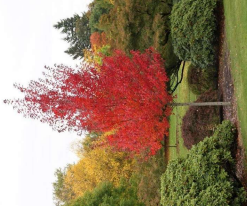
YELLOWWOOD

Climate-change appropriate, rounded, slow-growing, fragrant white flowers



“AUTUMN SPLENDOR” BUCKEYE

Produces nuts, best used in naturalized settings with deep, moist, slightly acidic soil



RED MAPLE

Strong central leader, well branched, decent drought tolerance



“DANCING FLAME” QUAKING ASPEN

No seed litter/fuzz, drought tolerance excellent color



“PERFECTION” HONEYLOCUST

One of the most drought tolerant and climate resilient, highly adapted to poor soils and moisture extremes, great street tree



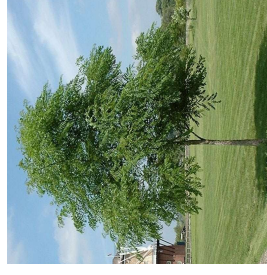
ALL TREES ARE 8-12 FOOT BARE ROOT

AMERICAN ELM

Widely adaptable, tolerates wet soil and acid to high pH, climate extremes



KENTUCKY COFFEETREE “ESPRESSO”

Arching branches, gorgeous adulthood, clean branching



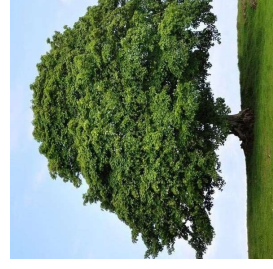
“FRONTYARD” LINDEN

Great shade and fragrant, pollinator tree, adaptable to soil types and pH



SWAMP WHITE OAK

Excellent heat and drought resistance, superb street tree



AMERICAN SYCAMORE

Climate resilient, prefers full sun and moist soils, strong wood, liters twigs/fruit

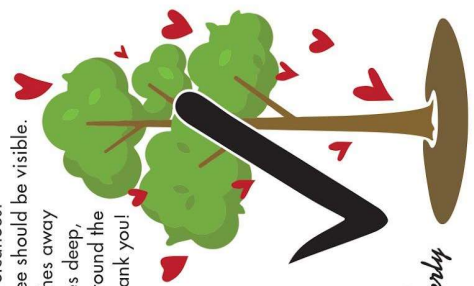
MULCH VOLCANO

Mulch 'volcanoes' piled up against tree trunks are harmful to trees, causing decay of the bark that leads to bigger issues – even the death of your tree.

Make doughnuts, not volcanoes.

The root flare of the tree should be visible.

Mulch should be 3 inches away from the trunk, 3 inches deep, and in a 3-foot ring around the tree. Your trees will thank you!
